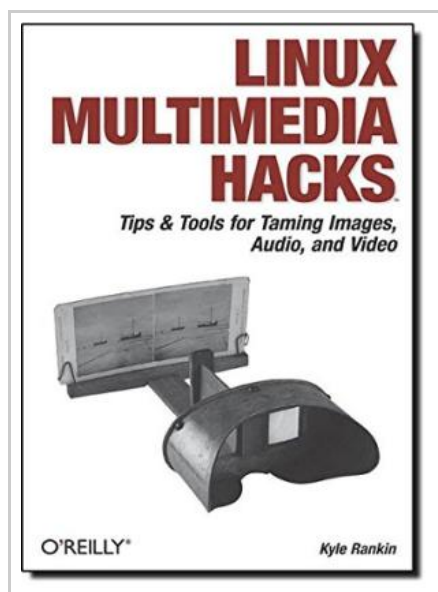




Linux Multimedia Hacks
