The author, writing under a pseudonym, has changed all of the names of persons, places and institutions, lest some individuals might be identified. Because it presents controversial viewpoints, the book is an excellent source for church discussion groups, especially in Episcopal and Roman Catholic parishes. It evokes questions rather than answers. It is a must-read for all clergy! The author grew up as a High-church Episcopalian. He was a pioneer in ecumenical relations during the 1960s and 1970s. As a liberal Episcopal priest, he taught religion and moral theology in a Roman Catholic high school and university. Eventually, the battles of church politics and hypocrisy took their toll, resulting in anger, disillusionment, loss of faith and depression. Finally, after decades of agnosticism, he found faith in Roman Catholicism, with reservations about certain moral tenets. This raises more questions. Can a Biblical, political and social liberal, in good conscience, also be a Roman Catholic...
