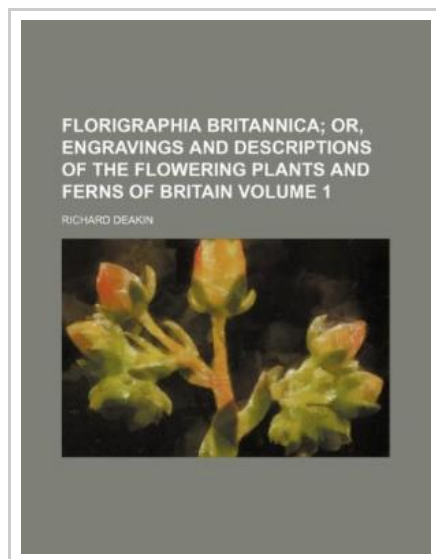

Capsule of one cell and four equal valves. Seeds numerous, each attached to the receptacle by its own stalk. Insignificant weeds, with axillary white and greenish flowers.
