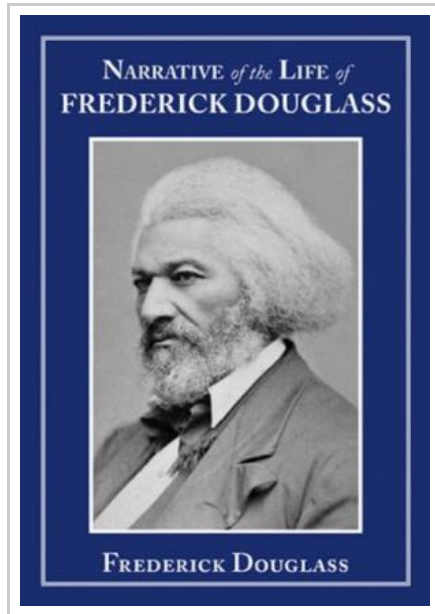




Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass
